

KENN PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on Monday 12th April 2010 in the Village Hall at 8.00 p.m.

Present:

The minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were read and signed.

Matters arising:

Warrens Holiday Village. The Enforcement Officer is dealing with the contravention of the planning conditions. He has warned that it may take some time. Car registration numbers are being checked with the DVLA for evidence of permanent addresses and the site's own register is being examined.

Parish Plan. A splendid Parish Plan has been produced and distributed. Thanks were recorded to all those people concerned in its production particularly Ray Granger who wrote it. £200 of the grant remains for postage and any other costs still to be incurred.

Financial statement:

The financial statement was circulated and approved. Its adoption was proposed by Mrs. Naish and seconded by Mrs. Quinn

Best Kept Village Competition:

Kenn will enter the competition again this year. Volunteers will be asked to help tidy up the village on 1st May. This will be advertised as widely as possible. North Somerset will be asked to lend litter picks and trim the verges if possible.

Kenn Festival:

There is to be a village festival during the last weekend in June with many activities including a Flower Festival in the Church, a Scarecrow Trail, cream teas and a barbecue. The Parish Council has precepted for extra money to help finance some of these activities as they are to benefit the whole village.

Village Hall:

£250 (Cheque 209) was given to the Village Hall Committee to purchase a new refrigerator for the Hall as it will be needed during the Festival and for subsequent events.

Refuse Collections:

New refuse collection arrangements which will involve households separating food waste from residual waste and a weekly collection of recycled material is to begin in July. Each household will be supplied with the appropriate containers.

Firework displays:

The police have undertaken to ask those premises likely to be having firework displays to supply them with a list which will then be passed on.

Daffodils on verges:

The daffodils have been absolutely beautiful this spring and it was agreed that more should be planted at the correct time. It was also agreed to sow wild flower seed so that there is colour at another time of the year.
